# Kathy:

Per our conversation Tuesday, Kirk said we could go ahead with acting as your certified operator. In order to keep things with the normal flow, this would be per the following:

- 1. SPB would be there twice a month with an estimated 5.0 hours per trip, which includes travel time. All trips will be billed on a time and material basis. (See attached fee schedule.)
- 2. SPB would continue training of onsite (OIT) operators. Paperwork would need to be submitted directly to this office. --Easy peasy. We do this with our other California clients.
- 3. Onsite operators will collect compliance samples which will be picked up and transported by WET labs.
- 4. Loyalton will provide analysis reports to this office for operator review.
- 5. The city of Loyalton will prepare the monthly/quarterly reports and SPB will review and sign per regulatory requirements. (Reports would have to be emailed to us for signature and then we could return them to you (FedEx/UPS) or send them to the State per your direction. Kirk Peterson is our California certified operator and Ken Mallory will be working under his direction. His certificate is attached.) --A side note: The State of California is working towards having all reporting done through a web-based system, so report processing may look differently very soon.

SPB will need to make at least one more trip to meet with the current operator to make sure that all the necessary information has been imparted--maybe two. Ken Mallory will need to determine this after his first visit.

Dear Loyalton City Council Members:

In May 2019, the City of Loyalton (City) requested that Farr West pursue potential companies to replace the current wastewater operator of record, John Cussins. Since then, Farr West instigated discussions with two companies, Valley Operators and SPB Utilities (SPB). Representatives from both companies attended a site visit of the wastewater system in early September 2019 and expressed interest in potentially taking over wastewater operations in Loyalton.

Due to logistical reasons, Valley Operators decided they could not feasibly fill the position. SPB submitted a fee schedule and proposed list of responsibilities to City Office Clerk, Kathy LeBlanc, on September 25, 2019. I have reviewed this information and recommend that the City move forward with hiring SPB to serve as the operator of record. Farr West has worked with SPB on many projects and feels that they are well qualified for this position. Additionally, John recommends SPB and is happy to help with the transition of responsibilities.

In order to ensure a smooth transition from the current operations to SPB, Farr West highly recommends that the following tasks take place:

- Gather all documents, plan sets, monitoring reports, etc. that pertain to the wastewater system and make them readily available to SPB staff.
- Organize a meeting between John, the current OITs, and SPB staff to review how the wastewater system is managed.
- The City must designate who will be considered the emergency contact when system emergencies
  occur and assign the appropriate compensation and responsibilities to the emergency contact.
- Ensure that all OIT hours worked under John's wastewater operator's license are accounted for and approved by John before SPB takes over system operations.
- Designate a specific start date for SPB to assume the designated operator of record position for the Loyalton wastewater system.

It has been a genuine pleasure working with John Cussins and I appreciate how much he has taught me about Loyalton and the wastewater system. I wish him the best in his future endeavors. We look forward to working with SPB and the City to continue solving any wastewater system needs.

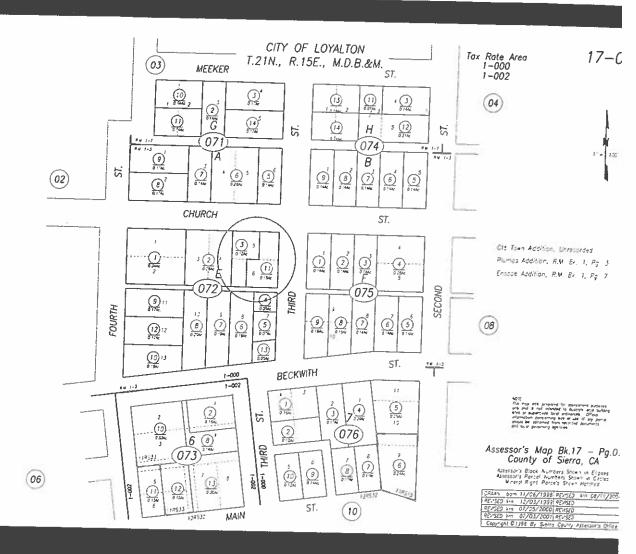

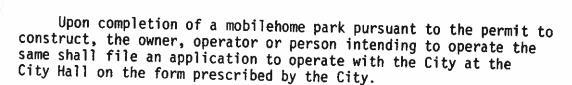

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# B. City Building Inspector to Inspect

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1. Who is BlackRock Liquidity Fund? history, reliability, ratings, any info on them?

The Liquidity Fund is a CalTRUST Fund. BlackRock is our investment manager who manages the funds. The Liquidity Fund was created in 2018. The attached information provides characteristics of the fund as well as a yield comparison of all the funds.

2. Are "shares" a riskier way to invest money? What is the risk level involved with investing with shares over a more traditional savings type of account?

The discharge of domestic wastewater from the City of Loyalton (City) Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) in Sierra County is regulated by Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) Order R5-2009-0108 and Cleanup and Abatement Order (CAO) R5-2013-0700. The collection system is regulated under the State Water Resources Control Board's (Board) Sanitary Sewer System General Order 2006-0003-DWQ. Pursuant to Water Code sections 13304 and 13267, the CAO issued in 2013 ordered that quarterly progress reports be submitted describing the work completed to date for compliance of the requirements set forth not only in the CAO but also in the WDRs.

In August of 2018, the City contracted Farr West Engineering (Farr West) to assist in handling the outstanding requirements defined in the WDRs and CAO shown in Table 1.

This report will summarize the work performed during the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter (Q3) of 2019.

### **OPERATIONAL CHANGES** 1.2

Immediately after the September 17th meeting, WWTP operators modified their operations as listed in Section 1.0 to drain the south pond. Farr West created an effluent storage pond monitoring log to document pond water level, number of whales, approximate locations, and approximate size. Starting the week of September 23<sup>rd</sup> and continuing weekly until the CAO is satisfied, the operators will document the storage ponds utilizing this monitoring log. Monitoring logs completed in Q3 2019 are included in Appendix B.

Lastly, John Cussins had a conversation with the Grandi Ranch owner about the possible extension of the November 1st irrigation discharge cutoff date in case the south pond needs to be drained past November 1st. According to John, the owner was responsive to the extension and is willing to work with the City.

### 1.3 CONTRACTUAL CHANGES AND LEAK DETECTION TESTING

Farr West submitted an updated contract (Task Order #5) for City Council approval at the October 15, 2019 meeting. Task Order #5 includes the following tasks:

- Farr West is to continue writing and submitting the CAO quarterly progress reports and WDR annual monitoring reports.
- Farr West is to provide subconsultant oversight services for the leak detection testing.
- Subconsultant, Layfield Group, is to provide leak detection testing on both effluent ponds through the electrical arc method (ASTM D7953). After testing is completed, Layfield Group will submit a report on the leak detection results, any repairs made, and certification of the pond liner integrity if no major repairs are needed.

Under Task Order #5, Layfield Group will conduct electrical arc leak detection testing on the south pond this November and the north pond at the end of irrigation season next year. Task Order #5 was approved at the October 15th City Council meeting and is included in Appendix C.

# **CAO WORK COMPLETED IN Q3 2019**

The following sections summarize the work completed in Q3 2019 for each CAO item presented in Table 1.

# CAO QUARTERLY PROGRESS REPORTS

The Q2 2019 progress report was submitted to the Board on July 19, 2019. Under the current contract (Task Order #2) with the City, Farr West is required to investigate, monitor, and report on the items identified in this report through the first quarter of 2019. The City has requested that Farr West continue this work, so Farr West submitted a new contract (Task Order #5) to the City for review and approval at the October 15th, 2019 City Council meeting. In Task Order #5, Farr West has committed to complete and submit the following reports on behalf of the City:

- CAO Quarterly Progress Reports Q3-4 2019 and Q1-4 2020
- WDR Annual Monitoring Report 2019 and 2020

Kirk Peterson of SPB will serve as the operator of record for the Loyalton WWTP starting November 1, 2019. His California license is included in Appendix D. The City will continue to employ the current OITs, Kenn Bennett and Keith Jordan. These OITs will oversee the day to day operations with the supervision of SPB staff and continue to work towards their full wastewater certifications.

# 2.9 CORRECTIVE ACTION REPORT WITH WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN

The CAO still requires that a Corrective Action Plan be submitted to the Board that details the plan for repair of the storage ponds. The extent of required repairs will not be known until Layfield Group completes the electrical arc leak detection testing. Therefore, the Corrective Action Plan will be submitted after the leak detection testing is complete.

# 2.10 AS-BUILTS AND CERTIFICATION FOR PONDS

As detailed in Section 1.3, Layfield Group has been contracted through task order #5 to complete electrical arc leak detection testing on the south pond this November and on the north pond at the end of irrigation season next year. The electrical arc testing methods comply with ASTM D7953 (included in Appendix E).

If small leaks are found during the electrical arc testing, Layfield Group will complete spot repairs and write a report that certifies the integrity of the pond liner. If large leaks are found and Layfield Group is unable to perform spot repairs, they will submit a report detailing the results of the leak detection testing and the extent of repairs needed. Once the extent of repairs needed is known, Farr West will submit the Corrective Action Plan for restoring the integrity of the pond liner.

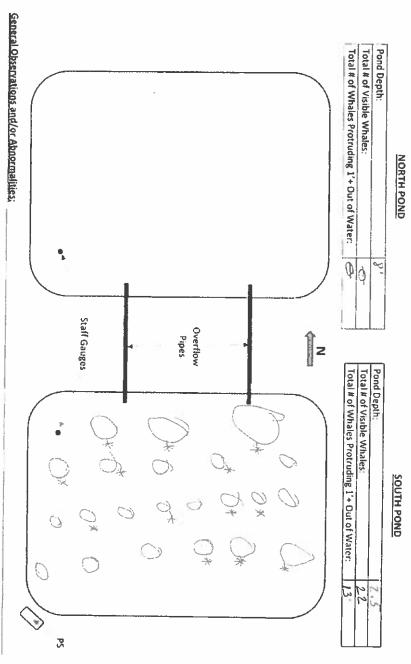

## 4. Significance and Use

- 4.1 Geomembranes are used as barriers to prevent liquids from leaking from landfills, ponds, and other containments. For this purpose, it is desirable that the geomembrane have as little leakage as practical.
- 4.2 The liquids may contain contaminants that if released can cause damage to the environment. Leaking liquids can crode the subgrade, causing further damage. Leakage can result in product loss or otherwise prevent the installation from performing its intended containment purpose.
- 4.3 Geomembranes are often assembled in the field, either by unrolling and welding panels of the geomembrane material together in the field, unfolding flexible geomembranes in the field, or a combination of both.
- 4.4 Geomembrane leaks can be caused by poor quality of the subgrade, poor quality of the material placed on the geomembrane, accidents, poor workmanship, manufacturing defects, and carelessness.
- 4.5 Electrical leak location methods are an effective and proven quality assurance measure to detect and locate leaks.

# 5. Summary of Exposed Geomembrane Electrical Location Methods

- 5.1 Principles of the Electrical Leak Location Methods for Exposed Geomembranes:
- 5.1.1 The principle of the electrical leak location methods is to place a voltage across a geomembrane and then locate areas where electrical current flows through leaks in the geomembrane.
- 5.1.2 Currently available methods include the water puddle method (Practice D7002), the water lance method (Practice D7703), and the arc testing method.
- 5.1.3 All of the methods listed in 5.1.2 are effective at locating leaks in exposed geomembranes. Each method has specific site and labor requirements, survey speeds, advantages and limitations. A professional specializing in the electrical leak location methods can provide guidance on the advantages and disadvantages of each method for a specific project (see Guide D6747).
- 5.1,4 Alternative ASTM Standard Practices for electrical leak location survey methods should be allowed when mutually agreeable and warranted by adverse site conditions, clearly technical superiority, logistics, or schedule.

## 6. Arc Testing Method

6.1 A summary of the method capabilities and limitations is presented in Table 1.

Non-I—If used, conductive-backed geomembrane must be installed per the manufacturer's recommendations in order to allow it to be tested using all of the available electrical leak location methods. In particular, there must be some means to break the conductive path through the fusion welds along the entire lengths of the welds, the undersides of adjacent panels (and patches) should be electrically connected together, and a means of preventing unwanted grounding at the anchor trenches or other unwanted earth grounds should be provided.

- 6.2 The Principle of the Arc Testing Method:
- 6.2.1 The principle of this electrical leak location method is to introduce a high voltage between a leak detection test probe and the conductive medium underneath the geomembrane. The area is then swept with a test probe to locate points where the current completes the circuit through a leak. A visible electrical are is formed when the current completes the circuit and the current flow is also converted into an alarm (audible, visual or other, which confirms leak detection and location).
- 6.2.2 Fig. 1 shows a wiring diagram of the arc tester, power supply and test probe for the arc testing electrical leak location method.
- 6.3 Leak Location Surveys of Exposed Geomembrane Using the Arc Testing Method:
- 6.3.1 A grid, test lanes or other acceptable system should be used to ensure that the entire area is tested with the test probe.
- 6.3.2 The probe attachment can be different shapes and lengths, depending on the application to be surveyed. The test probe may be wider than 1 m, but with a longer the probe it may be more difficult to make good contact with the geomembrane along its length.
  - 6.4 Preparations and Measurement Considerations:
- 6.4.1 Testing must be performed on geomembranes that are generally clean and dry. For geomembrane covered by water or soils, other test procedures, such as described in Guide D6747 are used for testing the geomembrane.
- 6.4.2 Proper field preparations and other measures shall be implemented to ensure an electrical connection to the conductive material directly below the geomembrane is in place to successfully complete the leak location survey.
- 6.4.3 There shall be a sufficiently conductive material below the geomembrane being tested. A properly-prepared subgrade typically will have sufficiently conductivity. Under proper
