Excerpt from the 2019-2019 Sierra County Grand Jury Report

SECTION 2.3: OVERALL CONCLUSION OF CITY GOVERNMENT

The Grand Jury's year-long investigation into the City of Loyalton, taking into consideration all of the facts gathered, leads to the following finding and recommendations.

Findings

F2.3.1 The City and Council have demonstrated, over a number of years, that they are unable to manage the City in a responsible, transparent, and ethical manner.

Recommendations

- R2.3.1 It is the recommendation of this Grand Jury that, by December 31, 2019, the Council adopt a resolution to disincorporate the City. (See Appendix 3: Disincorporation)
- R2.3.2 It is the further recommendation of this Grand Jury that, if, by December 31, 2019, the Council fails or refuses to adopt a resolution to disincorporate the City, the citizens of the City initiate disincorporation proceedings by petition. (See Appendix 3: Disincorporation)

Required responses

In regards to Finding F2.3.1 and Recommendation R2.3.1, the Council shall respond in writing to the presiding judge of the superior court within ninety (90) days of the release of this report.

LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION OF SIERRA COUNTY POLICIES AND STANDARDS

 The change of organization or reorganization promotes public access and accountability for community service needs and financial resources.

5.6. Disincorporations and Districts Dissolutions

- a) Grounds for Disincorporation and District Dissolutions. LAFCO will approve a proposal for disincorporation/dissolution only if it determines that:
 - i) the services offered or authorized are no longer necessary, or
 - ii) the services can be provided more efficiently by another agency or provider and that agency agrees to provide the services; or
 - iii) the agency is insolvent and unable to provide the services.
- b) <u>Bonded Indebtedness</u>. Where possible, LAFCO shall condition any dissolution to provide for the repayment of any bonded indebtedness or other obligations of the dissolved agency.
- c) <u>Disposition of Remaining Funds.</u> A disincorporated city must turn its treasury over to the County Treasurer within thirty (30) days of disincorporation. A dissolved district shall turn over its funds to its successor as determined under §57451.

The City of Loyalton is requesting that the registered voters of the City provide a non-binding answer on whether they would support a potential vote in the future to disincorporate.

If initiated by petition or by ballot, the City of Loyalton will need to complete several in depth and potentially costly studies that would then need to be considered by LAFCo. If LAFCo approves of the disincorporation the final approval must be granted by the voters of the City of Loyalton.

Prior to expending the City's resources on potentially costly studies, the City Council would like to gauge the opinion and potential outcome by an advisory vote of the registered voters of the City.

A "YES" vote means you are in favor of the disincorporation of the City of Loyalton.

A "NO" vote means you are not in favor of the disincorporation of the City of Loyalton and would like it to remain incorporated.
